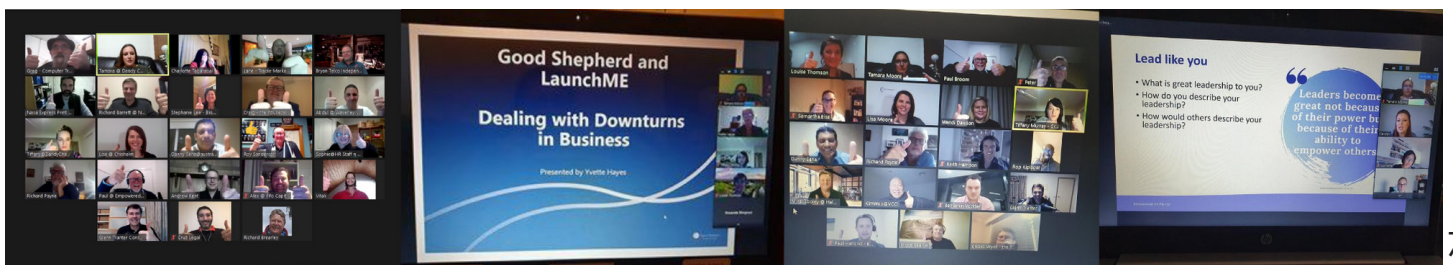


## Chamber Business Workshops
